

# Guide to Lot, Space, and Burial Information

The layout of all lots has north pointing up (like a map). Thus, for example, Space 2 in Lot 800 is in the southwest corner of that lot.

The space numbers start in the upper left-hand corner, continue south, then resume in the upper right-hand corner... as seen in the examples below. Some lots have 4 spaces, and other lots have 8 spaces.

If a lot (or a space in a lot) is dedeed to someone, then that information will appear in the notes.

Frederick Smith 1898

A "(c)" after a name means that the person was cremated.

A "(b)" after a name means that person died when they were a baby.

The date that appears after a name is the burial date. If no date is shown, then it isn't known.

If a name is printed outside the 'box', then the exact space isn't known.

A "(v)" after a name means that the person was a veteran. Veterans' names are also printed in blue ink.
